What a time the last half of 2014 has been as Friendship Force International reworks the concept of exchanges and asks for more accountability and creativity from the clubs. The backbone of the organization has been international and domestic club-to-club exchanges. Most of us joined Friendship Force to participate in this type of exchange and haven't looked back – enjoying many trips and making new friends around the world and within our club.

Under FFI CEO Joy DiBenedetto's leadership, FFI has challenged clubs to be creative and build exchanges that are more active, more inclusive of all age groups, and theme-based. Members of our club met last fall to brainstorm around this challenge; we submitted two ideas to FFI and will hear soon whether they have been accepted. The first is a "Farm-to-Table" exchange for 2016 where we will show how important Iowa is to food production, food history, and food creativity. The second, for 2017, is "Play Des Moines" where ambassadors will participate in a variety of light sports such as hiking, dancing, bowling, canoeing, and biking.

The club's goals for 2015 are:

- Reestablish a mentoring program for new members



Tennis shoes that our American kids have worn but outgrown are highly prized there. For some reason, little girls receive more donations than the boys, so sneakers for boys size 2-9 are needed.

I am asking the members of FFGDM to help me take shoes to Guatemala. I am NOT asking for new shoes, but those your own sons, grandsons, nephews, neighbors have outgrown and are willing to donate to me for this purpose. 



March 1, 2015, will be the 10th observance of World Friendship Day by Friendship Force clubs worldwide. The first celebration, March 1st, 2005, was known as "Friendship Day Around the World." March 1st is officially designated as the anniversary date for the entire organization. The selection of March 1st is a tribute to founder Wayne Smith based on the original founding day of the Friendship Force on March 1st, 1977, in a White House ceremony announced by President Jimmy Carter.
