

Midwest Leadership Conference Report

Friendship Force Midwest Leadership Conference: Success Strategies for Our Future

April 30 to May 2

Hosted by Friendship Force of Cedar Rapids/Iowa City

Will Friendship Force still be alive and kicking in ten more years? If it is, it will be up to the members who are active now. That's basically what I gleaned from this conference. The conference was my first experience at any type of regional gathering, and I learned a lot and thoroughly enjoyed it. The clubs represented were Ames, Cedar Rapids, Chicago, Des Moines, Lincoln, Madison, Milwaukee, Northern Illinois, Omaha, the Quad Cities, St. Louis, and the Twin Cities. As always, there were many friendly people that had lots of good ideas and suggestions.

All clubs were encouraged to have a strategic plan in place soon with some short-term goals as well as long-term goals. The Strategic Plan Overview was presented by Matthew Nidek from FFI and Dave Kalan from the FFI Board of Directors. They also talked about NextGen programming which will be exchanges that appeal to everyone, but especially those in their 20's and 30's. The exchanges need to be shorter and packed with more physical or hands-on activities. Many clubs shared what they were doing to try and attract new and/or younger members. Some were using Facebook, Twitter, Meetup, Themed Exchanges, Community Involvement, LEO'S (Let's Eat Out), and monthly breakfasts with a meet and greet topic for discussion.



There were break-out sessions to discuss clubs' strengths and weaknesses as well as ways to increase membership. The largest club there was Lincoln with over 200 members. They have a detailed plan for membership including a spreadsheet to record who was asked and when and what their responses were. Extensive tracking and follow-up are involved to insure success.

On our arrival to Cedar Rapids, Shelley Bain and I went to the home Mary and Frank Stull, our hosts for the conference. Thursday evening was spent networking and eating at the Prairie Oak Lodge at Squaw Creek Park in Marion. We had appetizers and wine followed by a potluck.

The conference itself was held at the Human Services Campus in Cedar Rapids that had very nice facilities .On Friday afternoon, our host Mary gave us a tour of some of the highlights of Cedar Rapids. Friday evening included a visit to the historic Brucemore Mansion with drinks and out-of-this- world appetizers.

Adrienne Moen, our Midwest Region Representative and former FFGDM club president, was essential in the planning of this very successful conference and also chaired it. The next time you see her, tell her thanks for getting involved and for promoting Friendship Force in the Midwest.
