RECOLLECTIONS OF THE FIRST YEARS OF FRIENDSHIP FORCE

On September 17, 1978, we found out at a Friendship Force meeting that we were on stand-by for home hosting the Dublin ambassadors coming to Des Moines in October.

On October 16, 1978, we received a phone call at 4:30 from Kay Gremlich who asked us if we would take two ambassadors from Dublin! Of course, we said yes. Joan and John White (sister and brother) arrived that evening - Ken took vacation in order to spend time with our guests. We had a great time with those "kids" who were probably in their early 20's. We visited the Governor's mansion, the Art Center, my farm home in Clear Lake and spent a day in the Amana Colonies. Joan and John met several of our friends, neighbors and church members -- everyone enjoyed visiting with them.

In July of 1979, Ken was sent to England as part of his job at Massey Ferguson. This would be a great time to visit the Whites, so I flew with Ken, spent a couple of days in the London area, then flew to Ireland. I spent a week there and had a fantastic time. Ken joined us for several days after his work in London was completed. This was our first experience in a foreign country. The five Whites were so welcoming and we still remember many of the things we did and places we went.

After all of these years, we still have fond memories of their visit to our home and our visit to Dublin. We kept in contact for many years and John visited us several times after 1978.



Mary Marshall and Charlotte Buttin recently traveled to the Holy Land.


