WHERE IN THE WORLD ARE ANN AND RON ROWLAND?

Ron and Ann Rowland recently spent 7 days in western Nicaragua on a Road Scholar trip; they also traveled three days on their own. They found Nicaragua to be a lovely and peaceful country, considered one of the safest in Central America, and the people were warm and gracious.

They visited the cities of Managua, Leon, Maltagalpa, Jinotega, and Granada. Leon and Granada are especially old colonial cities with an abundance of historic architecture. In addition, the Rowlands visited the Pacific Coast, two volcanos, a rum factory, a coffee plantation and two markets--one (Masaya) selling craft items primarily to tourists and the second (Granada) selling primary daily use items to the local Nicaraguan population.



WILL YOU BE A MENTOR TO NEW MEMBERS?

- Arrive at the event before the Mentee so they can be welcomed
- Introduce Mentee to members
- Sit with Mentee at the event
- Encourage Mentee to ask questions
- Discuss what the Mentee expectations are with a membership in FFGDM
- Communicate with the Mentee at least once a month for 6 months or until the mentee is comfortable with the organization.
