FFGDM By The Numbers

It is interesting to note how participatory our club is. Out of thirty-one (31) events and or committees for 2018 we saw participation rates that probably represent nearly any local organization. Out of seventy-seven members, only two (.02%) attended twenty plus meetings and or events. Thirteen members, a whopping 16%, failed to attend even one event. The most popular attendance rate was for those people attending from one to five events at thirty people or 38%. Fifteen people, or 19%, attended 6-10 events and thirteen people (16%) attended 11-15 events. Only three of our members (.03%) attended 16-20 events. As these numbers show, no group hit the 50% mark, and only by adding all participatory groups together do we even get somewhat near the 75% participation rate.

I know I just threw a lot of numbers at you, but it makes me wonder what it would take to get a better participation rate. Did you even know we keep track of these numbers? Did you know that on any outbound trip with too many applicants, your participation rate may contribute to your odds of being selected? So, back to the numbers, how do we reduce the 16% of non-attendees to maybe 5%? And how in the world do we give proper accolades to the five people who attended sixteen or more events? Should I be naming those five people here? Would that encourage the rest of us to do better?

The board recently conducted a planning session to develop, goals, objectives, and action plans for the coming year. Increasing membership was one such goal, and a good one. Did we miss the mark though? Should we be working on how to increase participation instead or in addition to membership goals?

If you think these numbers are just fine, you probably have plenty of company. If you'd like to see those participatory numbers increase, we'd like to hear your ideas on how to accomplish that. Any board member would be happy to hear your ideas and pass them on at a future board meeting. It's your club. We thrive on new ideas. Let us have it. – Pat Headley, President
