Our club hit a double with an outbound journey to two clubs: April 22-27 FF Knoxville, TN April 27-May 4 FF Big Canoe, GA

Knoxville was the first capitol of Tennessee. The city has positioned itself in recent years as a repository of Appalachian culture and is one of the gateways to the Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

Big Canoe is a gated community, consisting of over 8,000 acres, located in the mountains approximately 60 minutes north of Atlanta. Nearly one-third of the total property has been set aside as wildlife areas and parks.

We'll share our time in Big Canoe with the club from West Alajuela, Costa Rica; our first time participating in a combined domestic and international journey.

FRIENDSHIP FORCE INTERNATIONAL WORLD CONFERENCE

Boulder or Bust! Planes, trains, and automobiles! That's the way our members traveled to the Friendship Force International World Conference at the University of Colorado at Boulder from July 23-25. There were 425 delegates in attendance from 24 countries. Pat Headley and Ginny Renda flew, Janette House and Jane Escobar took the train, and Cookie Major and Marla Carr drove an automobile.

Attendees all experienced dorm life all over again by sharing rooms, bathrooms, and eating dorm food. The dorm food and dining experience was much improved over what they remembered as college students. It's not every day that people get to eat breakfast outside with a view of the mountains, especially if you're from Iowa.

The conference began on Wednesday, July 24th at 8:50 with the CU cheerleaders leading us in a Friendship Force cheer, followed by an address from Jeremi Snook, our FFI CEO and president. He shared FFI's vision of the future for our organization. After this introduction, there were 3 breakout sessions that allowed people to share ideas and discuss ways to strengthen and grow FFI. Many of the sessions dealt with using technology to improve the visibility and operations of a club. Other classes focused on sharing the Friendship Force experience with photos and

The conference concluded at an outdoor celebration with a barbeque and blue grass band on a rooftop venue in downtown Boulder. Awards were given for outstanding volunteers and clubs who had helped increase membership and strengthened clubs.

After the conference, there was an optional 2-day extension that offered more ways to explore and enjoy the Boulder area. Some people chose the electric bike tour of Boulder, some went on Banjo Billy's bus tour of Boulder, and others

hiked at Chautauqua Park, toured the Celestial Seasonings factory, strolled through the farmer's market, and visited an exquisite tearoom given to them by their sister city. There was also a local Foodie Tour, great shopping, and wonderful restaurants.

All the Des Moines attendees thought the conference was informative, enjoyable, and well-worth attending. Members relished reconnecting with old friends from other journeys and making new friends at the conference. After they return, they are excited to share some new ideas with local club members.
