At the annual meeting, we spent a few minutes reflecting on what you, the members, want 2020 to look like. You had some great ideas. Now let's see if you can turn those ideas into action plans. I also gave a brief report on the number of members and visitors who attended certain events this past year. It gave us a glimpse into what events are popular, but hopefully sparked ideas for what we could yet be doing. Here's what the numbers revealed.



Eighteen Friendship Force of Greater Des Moines members and friends packaged meals during our twohour shift on August 31 for the 12th Annual Meals from the Heartland Hunger Fight.

Meals from the Heartland is a non-profit organization that packages meals for malnourish people in Iowa, the US, and the world.

We filled meal bags with rice, soy protein, vitamins, minerals, and dried vegetables, weighed and sealed the bags, then stacked them in boxes. We filled 42 boxes, each containing 36 meal bags. That'd a total of 1,512 meal bags. Each meal bag contains 6 servings. That totals 9,072 meal servings. Wow! Great job FFGDM team. Thank you to all who participated in helping to alleviate hunger around the world.



#### WHERE IN THE WORLD ARE MIKE, RONDA, DEE, AND PEGGY?

Mike Davis, Ronda Davis, Dee Willemsen, and Peggy Brown journeyed to Jordan with FFI in October, along with members from Washington, Oregon, Florida, California, Wisconsin, Utah, and Hawaii. Instead of the rolling hills of Iowa covered in corn and soybeans ready for harvest, we experienced a country that was mostly khaki-colored, from the sands of desert to the buildings to the rocky hills. The landscape was often stark as we drove along steep hills and into valleys. The people were warm and welcoming as we enjoyed a 2-night home stay, 4 nights in Bedouin goat-hair tents, and 5 nights in luxurious hotels.



We spent two days exploring Petra and the ancient caravan stops nearby, two days in Amman, and two days at the Dead Sea. We ate dinners in two family homes and a women's cooperative where women are making a living preparing meals and making and selling crafts, and lunches at a different women's cooperative and a craft cooperative. We gained understanding of the way of life in urban, rural, and desert settings. A great experience.
