There's also a two-night extension in Edinburgh that includes Rosslyn Chapel, the Royal Yacht Britannia, the Palace of Holyroodhouse, and afternoon tea. Please contact me for details.

# Where in the World are Mary and Shelley?



Mary and I joined FFI's "Discover Spain & Portugal". It was large in number, 30 each on two different tours, and large in opportunities to see the best of Spain and Portugal. Moorish history and Spanish architecture were the themes that ran throughout the tour.



Some of the places we experienced were Basílica de la Sagrada Família in Barcelona, designed by Antoni Gaudí; Santa Maria de Montserrat Abbey, rich and delicious Valencia paella (chicken based) in Valencia and Spain's modernist architecture is seen at the City of Arts and Sciences; the cave town of Guadix; the Alhambra; the tiled pavilion of the Plaza de España and Gothic Seville Cathedral; Royal Alcázar; lunch at the Seville Culinary Institute, a bull fighting and museum and a flamenco show, also in Seville; Church of St. Francis, known as the "Chapel of Bones" in Evora; an evening listening to Fado, Portugal's national musical treasure; Jerónimos Monastery, built to honor explorers, and an interactive cooking class where we made a traditional 3-course Portuguese meal; romanticist Pena Palace in the town of Sintra; the famous Catholic site of Fatima with its two cathedrals; a Porto Wine House; the world class Prada art museum in Madrid; and medieval alleyways and the gothic Toledo Cathedral. The farewell dinner was at a traditional Castilian restaurant with multiple courses and live tuna music. What a great time we had!

Minneapolis is the place to be this coming September. The Super Regional Conference will be held in downtown Minneapolis on 12th Street, between the Nicollet Mall and Hennepin Ave from Friday, September 18th through Sunday, September 20th. The fee is \$175 and includes two hotel nights and lunch on Saturday.

Highlights include a welcome reception on Friday afternoon, opening ceremony and plenary sessions of Saturday, with keynote speaker Jeremy Snook, FFI CEO and President.
