### The Path to Paradise

Seventeen members of Friendship Force visited the Art Center on May 11, to view a stainedglass exhibit. This exhibition titled, The Path to Paradise, displayed 45 of Judith Schaechter's stained glass panels along with a selection of related drawings and process panels.

Although much of Judith Schaechter's artwork hinged on the dark side, her unusual talent could certainly be appreciated. Her unique technique of blending medieval and contemporary subject matter into incredible and stunning panels of art was brilliant.

Some members of our club spent over two hours viewing and studying these amazing stain glass panels. As I left the Art Center, it occurred to me how fortunate we are to have in our community a facility that brings such nationally renowned art to Des Moines. — Ginny Renda Twenty members and guests stopped to smell the roses and have lunch at the Iowa Flower Farm on June 10.

The Iowa Flower Farm was established in 2019, with 400 roses and over 600 annuals and perennial flowers. Located near Maxwell, the farm sits on 10 acres in the Chichaqua Valley reserve.

Initially, the Iowa Flower Farm was started to provide locally grown cut flowers. This year they're planting over 3000 new flowers and roses and installed an irrigation system. Their goal in the next few years is to expand the farm to include several thousand cut flowers



and over 12,000 rose bushes. It's definitely an ambitious plan and they've committed to making it work.
