We took a docent-led tour of the Pappajohn Sculpture Park after lunch. This was much more informative than a self-guided phone tour. The pictures show how windy it was! Then we finished the evening with a small group dinner at Pat Headley's home. Lovely day of activities.



Tuesday, the first stop was a tour of the World Food Prize Hall of Laureates. Such a beautiful and important building. The second stop was Mainframe Studios in downtown Des Moines. This is a wonderful space for artists to produce and sell their artwork - rent is as little as a \$1 per square foot.

After lunch at Gilroy's, our 3rd stop was the Jordan House Museum. The original owners were part of the Underground Railroad that helped transport enslaved people trying to escape to Freedom. Our last activity of the day was a stop at the Knotty Nail in Valley Junction where the ambassadors created a string art souvenir. They were real troupers and most of them finished before they left the shop. In the evening, my ambassador took me to dinner at Johnny's Italian Steakhouse. It was a great day!



Wednesday was a Wish Day with ambassadors visiting places such as Salisbury House, Terrace Hill, the Art Center, Greater Des Moines Botanical Garden, and State Historical Building. The Farewell Party was held at Blank Golf Course Club House where the ambassadors shared their impressions of the week and received farewell gifts.

Hindu Temple and Cultural Center of Iowa Tour

Completed in 2005, the temple is a place of worship for Hindus living in Central Iowa and follows Vedic Traditions and Rituals practiced in India for over 2000 years.

We viewed the shrines and learned the importance of several deities including Ganesha, Vishnu, Lakshmi, Shiva, Parvati, and Saraswati. These deities have distinct and complex personalities yet are often viewed as aspects of

the same Brahman. Brahman connotes the highest universal principle and the ultimate reality in the universe. Hinduism is a complex religion and there was a lot of information to absorb. I guess you could say we tried to understand the principles of 2000 years of history and thought in a 40-minute tour – impossible!
