Where in the World...



... is Pat Headley?

London and Scotland! After a couple of days in London, my grandson Jarrett and I took

the train to Edinburgh. Fortunately, I had booked a hotel in the old town, which he fell in love with immediately. "This is my new favorite city," he said on day two. As a history major with an emphasis in museum studies, he had thoroughly enjoyed the British museum and now looked forward to the Scottish National Museum. He ended up visiting both twice. This was my sixth time visiting Scotland and several times walking the Royal Mile, but my



first time visiting Edinburgh Castle. Jarrett visited that twice as well. It was a nice

history lesson, but once was enough for me.

As if the Royal Mile wasn't enough exercise, we decided to climb Arthur's Seat, the highest point of a 823 foot hill overlooking much of Edinburgh. The hill is an ancient volcano which is the main peak of the group of hills which form most of Holyrood Park. The hill isn't all that high but much of it was almost straight up and incredibly rocky. Watching my step and drinking plenty of water was paramount. As usual, when I climb hills and mountains, I grumbled all the way up,



but then at the top I forgave myself and marveled at the views, thanking the universe for being able to still do it. At the top, we saw a large swath of the North Sea and the city of Edinburgh. At the end of the day, my phone told me I had walked 9.25 miles. Not bad for an old lady, and very little of it on flat ground.



We visited Jupiter Artland, an award-winning contemporary sculpture garden founded in 2009, the family village of my Clan Guthrie in Angus, and took pictures of our activities, including one with us

flanking a statue of the Robert Fergusson, the famous Scottish bohemian poet who was a great source of inspiration for Robert Burns.

The day before we were to leave

Edinburgh, I woke up with a scratchy throat, took a covid test and tested positive. Jarrett was on his own that day, but he did come back every couple of hours bringing me throat lozenges and bottles of various fluids "so you can stay hydrated."

Back in London, he was again on his own, but did find a four-story bookstore and managed to relieve them of much of their inventory. On our last morning, I put my mask on before leaving the hotel, and left it on until we walked through the front door of my house; 24 hours later. For more reasons than one, I was happy to be home. Still, it was a good trip, and I introduced the next generation of my family to international travel.
