On Sunday, April 16, forty members and guests celebrated Springfest on the day some called the "last throes of winter" for the light snow and wind that greeted us.



We heard from Brooke Heldt, a program director at the YMCA Supportive Housing Campus. What a benefit to the community Brooke and the Supportive Housing Campus are to members of our community. The "Our Housing First Model" helps people experiencing or at-risk of experiencing homelessness move into stable and secure permanent housing supplemented by supportive services. Wrap-around services help people meet their basic needs and reach their life goals.

They serve 140 people at a time who can stay up to 15 months. Their clients include the disabled, youth leaving



efficiency apartments that contain a bed, bathroom, and kitchenette. There are shared meals daily and many activities to engage the clients including a library, TV area, and walking club.

### Where in the World...

## ... are Mike and Sally Merritt?

We have a son, daughter, and two grandchildren that live in Pretoria, South Africa so we visited them, and while we were in South Africa, we visited three different safari lodges at Kruger National Park. My son and his family live in Pretoria where my son works for a part of John Hopkins which exports medical knowledge and practices to countries in the developing world, my daughter-in-law is the Deputy Chief of Mission at the US Embassy, and my grandchildren go to the Johannesburg International School.

Kruger is in northeastern South Africa, about a 5 – 6-hour drive from Pretoria. It is one of Africa's largest game reserves. Its high density of wild animals includes the Big 5: lions, leopards, rhinos, elephants, and buffaloes. Hundreds of other mammals make their home here, as do diverse bird species such as vultures, eagles, and storks. Our first safari park was the Mjejane River Lodge in Hectorspruit. Our guides are first class, knowledgeable and very experienced at finding the animals and



telling us all about them. Our son and daughter-in-law have been on quite a few safaris, so they have become birdwatchers and wound up with a list at the end of trip of approximately 50 bird species sighted.



Our second safari park is Kruger Shalati – the Train on a Bridge. The train is permanently stationed on the Selati Bridge above the Sabie River. The train trestle was built in the early 1920's, when visits to Kruger were first becoming available. The trestle hadn't been used for many years but was recently re-developed as a luxury hotel. The glass-walled train rooms allow for long views along the length of the Sabie River. The first thing we see after arriving is a herd of elephants parading down the river under the train trestle. Game drives are first thing in the morning (5:00 am wake-up calls), then late afternoon when the animals are most active.

Our third safari park is Tanda Tula Safari Lodge at Timbavati. This is a tented camp with outdoor showers. The tents are closed by zippers and a carabiner device, and we are cautioned to always

keep the tent closed and locked when we aren't in the room. Mike doesn't take this advice, and the monkeys break into the tent and destroy our breakfast tray. Shalati was inside Kruger National Park and the guides are required to stay on asphalt roads. At Tanda Tula we are outside (but adjacent to) Kruger, and there is no such restriction. The roads are all dirt, and the driver goes off-road right into the bush so we can get a better view of the animals.

We liked South Africa so much we are returning in March 2023, and we will do sightseeing in the Cape Town area of South Africa. Our son and family are still in Pretoria and will be until the summer of 2024. The trip to get there is very, very long, but worth it!
