Finally, some good news about traveling . . .

The US Department of Transportation issued new requirements on refunds when flights are canceled or delayed and on revealing "junk" fees before booking. Here's what we know about the D.O.T.'s new rules, which will begin to go into effect in October.

- There's now one definition for a "significant" delay.
- Passengers will get prompt refunds for cancellations or significant changes for flights and delayed bags, for any reason.
- Passengers with other flight disruptions, such as being downgraded to a lower service class, are also entitled to refunds.
- Airlines must give travel vouchers or credits to ticketed passengers unable to fly because of government restrictions or a doctor's orders.
- Fees for checked baggage and modifying a reservation must be disclosed upfront.
- The rules, which apply to all flights on domestic airlines and flights to and from the United States operated by foreign airlines, have varying start dates.




